Resume Roast

- 100- What is the biggest red flag on a resume? (Typos, long paragraphs, unprofessional lingo) (Note: Prompt them to give two answers, if not automatically given)
- 200- How long should a resume be for a recent graduate? (1 page)
- 300- These are two things every student should include on their resume (*Transferable skills, achievements, education section*)
- 400- The UCF Career Services virtual resume review platform that provides AI-generated feedback on your resume. (*VMock*)
- 500 A common mistake students make when formatting their resume (overly complicated design/ font, columns in their resume that ATS cannot read) (Note: Accept any other correct answers too)

Workplace potluck

- 100- You started an on-campus job recently. A great way to introduce yourself to your coworkers is this. (Share your major, ask their favorite part about the job, connect over similar classes)
- 200- This app helps you stay connected with on-campus job opportunities, events, and networking. (What is "Handshake?")
- 300- You are an introvert; this is your low-stress way to network (join smaller group conversations or connecting on Handshake and LinkedIn)
- 400- Your supervisor offers to mentor you- this is how you make the most of it! (ask for career advice, let them know your professional goals)
- 500- You have been asked to present a team project at a workplace event, but you're nervous. How can you make a strong impression? (What is "Practice your presentation, keep it concise and focused, engage the audience with questions or relatable examples, and be confident in your communication?")

Interview investigations:

- 100- Wearing pajamas to a virtual interview might make the interviewer think you lack this. (What is professionalism?)
- 200- Asking, "So, what does your company do?" during an interview is a sign that you failed to do this beforehand. (What is research?)

- 300- If an interviewer asks about salary expectations, the best way to prepare your answer is by doing this beforehand. (What is researching industry salary ranges?)
- 400- An interviewer asks, describe a situation where you demonstrated a NACE competency in your research. You should mention this (mention critical thinking, leadership, communication or teamwork. Any answer relevant to OUR's research tips)
- 500- When an interviewer asks, "Why should we hire you?" The best approach is to focus on this. (What is demonstrating how your skills and experience align with the company's needs?)

Paycheck 2 Paycheck

- 100- This department on campus looks over our monetary questions. (UCF Financial Aid)
- 200- This is the main difference between OPS and FWS (FWS is need-based and funded by the government, and OPS is funded by the university/ department)
- 300- The full-forms of FWS and OPS are these? (Other Personnel Services, Federal Work-Study)
- 400- The number of weekly hours required for the GA contract? (20 hours)
- 500- You have a different paycheck amount than expected? This could be a reason. (taxes cut off, incorrect hours logged on Workday)

Campus Connect-

- 100- This department helps you with professional and graduate school preparation. (Academic Advancement Programs)
- 200- You're looking to get involved with UCF's student organizations, but you don't know where to start. This is the best resource to find student clubs and events (*KnightConnect*, or *KoRT*, or *Knights Career Quest*)
- 300- UCF's Experiential Learning (EL) office offers a program that allows students to gain exposure to various career fields through short-term job shadowing experiences. What is the name of this program, and how can students participate? (UCF Knight Shadow Program, where students can participate in one-day shadow experiences with industry professionals during fall, spring, and summer semesters)
- 400- This is where you find professional headshots on campus (UCF Student Union)

500- You want to attend a lecture or seminar outside of class to expand your knowledge. Where can you find upcoming academic events at UCF? (UCF Events Calendar)
